"It's eight ounces of battery acid," said Lee's attorney, Pete Malouf.

Both Lee and Gilliatt have filed lawsuits.

Using information from both cases and discoveries by CBS-11, the federal government raided Alpha Omega labs nine months ago in Lake Charles, Louisiana. Agents seized barrels of the solution and arrested the owner, Caton, for having firearms, thousands of rounds of live ammunition, and body armour...all violations for a convicted felon. Caton had plead guilty to counterfeiting in 1990.

Now, Caton has pleaded guilty once again. This time for advertising and selling non-approved products as medicines that two women claim changed their lives.

"I do believe people should have the opportunity to have alternative treatments available," Gilliatt said. "But that they need to be safe as well as effective."

Caton's attorney says "Greg got a bad wrap. It doesn't appear Caton's materials are the cause of the medical claims the women are making. He (Caton) has a huge number of testimonials from people that have used these materials and think they're great. These are the only two people that have ever complained. both of them have very complicating factors involving other factors not limited to a Greg Caton product.

Caton must forfeit nearly one-million dollars and the buildings where he ran Alpha Omega Labs. He'll be sentenced in August.

Sue Gilliatt's lawsuit is still pending. Sharon Lee's attorney could not comment on the status of her case.
